

Welcome

Welcome to Camp Wisdom - recognized by Circle Ten Council, BSA as "The Oldest Boy Scout Camp in Texas". This 371 acre camp is also the only one in Circle Ten Council to have a Cub World, an area filled with special activities for young scouts to explore and have fun.

Camp Wisdom was originally the farm of John Shelby Wisdom, known as Daddy Wisdom to the Boy Scouts. He allowed them to camp on his farm in the late 1920's and in the 1930's gave his farm to the Boy Scouts. It was so named in his honor.

Online Registration Deadline

Online registration will close at 6 PM on Thursday, January 6th. Only a limited number of extra maps will be available so be sure to pre-register and reserve your spot. There will be competitive individual categories with awards, as well as recreational map-hikers for groups or individuals who just want to have fun. All courses will use electronic punching.

Beginner Classes

There will be a beginner clinic offered for those new to orienteering. There will also be a Boy Scout Orienteering Merit Badge clinic to review merit badge specific items and requirements. See the Schedule web page for more information.

Registration/Check-in

Registration and check-in will be conducted at the Trading Post pavilion (#1) just off the South end of the main parking area. Restrooms are available at the pavilion. E-punch finger stick rentals for all courses will also be handled at the pavilion.

Important BSA COVID protocols:

Circle Ten Council BSA requires that everyone entering the camp complete the following actions BEFORE arriving at Camp Wisdom.

- Adult individuals must complete the Pre-Event Screening Checklist (see Event Page for link)
- Group Leaders must complete and bring the C10 Arrival Checklist (see Event Page for link)
- Everyone should take their temperature before departing for camp and anyone with a fever should NOT attend

Courtesy and Out of Bounds Areas

The camp will have overnight campers and other activities ongoing the day of the meet so we need to be courteous when encountering other visitors. Do not travel through occupied campsites.

With the exception of toilet facilities, there are a number of buildings scattered throughout the camp, none of which are part of the orienteering meet. These buildings are all off limits and are not to be entered. Violators will be immediately disqualified.

Misc

The weather in January is always unpredictable so be sure to bring gear for all possibilities. And just because it may be cool doesn't mean you can forget about staying hydrated. Water will be available on the course, but it's always good to bring some with you.
